

# The Coaching for Everyone **Scholars Program**



## Program overview

The Scholars Program provides high-quality, culturally-relevant coach training and certification that accelerates learning and transforms the personal, professional, and social lives of BIPOC professionals.

## It includes:

-  Multi-day virtual training intensives with live BIPOC facilitator(s).
-  Free one-year membership to the Coaches of Color Network (COCN) - an exclusive network of hundreds of BIPOC professionals and allies, and an extensive library of coaching resources.
-  A highly personal, supportive, and interactive experience.
-  Access to top tier assessments and other support resources to start and elevate your coaching practice.

## Cost

Enrollment and payment for the full LEVEL TWO CFE program drops the tuition from \$12,000 to \$8,500. If you are paying out of pocket, you qualify for an additional \$1,000 scholarship, dropping tuition to \$7,500.

# What You Can Expect

- 1** Review the [Scholars Program page](#) to learn about the program and our coach training partnerships to review the training curriculum.
- 2** Apply for the Scholars Program. We will review your application and provide a status update within 2 - 3 weeks of submission.
- 3** If are accepted into the program, you will receive a welcome packet and checklist outlining actions you'll need to take to prepare for the program.
- 4** Attend a mandatory CFE orientation on what you can expect, ask questions, and meet members of your cohort! You'll also be added to the Coaching of Color Network (COCN) to start your complimentary one-year membership.
- 5** You'll receive a packet from our coach training partner with commitments you'll need to complete. You'll also participate in a mandatory orientation to learn what you can expect prior to, during, and after the coach training.
- 6** Attend multiple three-day training intensives. Led by a live facilitator, these virtual all-day sessions generally occur Thursday through Saturday during the scheduled week.
- 7** Complete post-work following the training, including peer work, mentor coaching, webinars, and other self-study projects.
- 8** Build and evolve your coaching practice by networking and growing with other members of the COCN.

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*Collectively, these steps take a minimum of 12 months to complete all certification requirements. Once you've completed 130 hours of coach training, you'll be considered a Certified Professional Coach and will be well on your way to International Coaching Federation (ICF) credentialing.*
